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Creating Your Team

Your journey to The Blast begins with a single step – create your team.

Who is your captain?

Choose someone who can recruit members and be a cheerleader for your team.

This individual will be the primary contact for communication between our team and yours. They will also have access to additional features like team page personalization, custom messages, and more.

Returning teams

If you are a returning team, the previous captain can re-start the team. To do so, go to www.blastwalk.org and click on Get Started > Join a Team > Log in > Reactivate previous team. If you need assistance with reactivating your team, please let us know and we can do it for you manually.

New teams

If you are a new team, your chosen captain can head to www.blastwalk.org to form your team. Click on Get Started > Start a Team > Join as a New Participant. If you need assistance with creating your team, please let us know and we can start it manually for you.

Discount codes

If your company is interested in covering the registration fees for your team, let us know. We can provide you with a discount code and send you an invoice for the total after the event. Please note that if you are a Blast sponsor, we will automatically provide you with a code that will allow you to register the number of participants included with your sponsor package. However, if your company would like to "unlock" your code for additional members of your company team, let us know and we can invoice you as mentioned above.



Recruiting Team Members

Participant recruitment

- Consider hosting a team kick-off event to encourage sign ups! Get together for a Saturday
 morning walk or an informational lunch during the work week to build excitement about the
 mission. Contact us for information about one of our team members coming to speak to your
 group and help with on-site registration.
- Hang a flyer in your office kitchen or break room or post in your digital workspace with a call to join your team. We are happy to create a customized flyer with a QR code to your team page.
- Insert your team page link in your email signature to spread the word to internal team members as well as your clients or partners.
- Use the email templates included below to share event details, inspirational stories, and your fundraising and participation goals.

Participant engagement

- Form a committee to plan your day at The Blast. You may decide to wear a group t-shirt or costume, bring giveaways for participants, decorate your team tent, or go out for a group lunch after the walk.
- Integrate The Blast with your company wellness incentives! Offer a raffle for reaching a daily or weekly step goal, train as a team to run a 5k, or award points towards your existing incentives for those who participate.
- Identify a Blast champion. Maybe there is an employee or associate affiliated with your company that is a current or former patient family. Within appropriate guidelines for privacy, ask that team member to share their experience and participate as the "champion" of your team.

Email #2: Meet Mighty Makenzie

At age 6, Makenzie was experiencing unexplained pain that kept her from sleeping through the night or reaching her goals at after-school gymnastics. After a visit to her pediatrician, and follow-up with specialists, her mom Amanda answered a phone call that no mother wants to receive. When scans showed signs of a tumor on Makenzie's spine, she was admitted to Cook Children's later that same day.

Starting on April 2, 2021, Makenzie endured months of treatment to battle Langerhans Cell Histiocytosis (LCH), a rare form of cancer. After three rounds of chemotherapy, Makenzie needed a halo ring implanted to keep compression off of her spine. The surgery placed rods and pins to keep her head and neck stationary while stabilizing her spinal cord.

Makenzie's care team at Cook Children's jumped into action to make the transition as smooth as possible for a young, active, and lively girl. With visits from a facility dog, play therapy to understand her treatments, and chaplains to come alongside her family and support system, Amanda was glad to see Makenzie's smile return.

On April 1, 2022, 364 days after her diagnosis, Makenzie walked with her family and friends at The Blast, celebrating being cancer-free after an incredibly difficult year. Amanda rallied their support system to raise \$10,615, winning the highest fundraising new team award. It was important for her to give back to the place and the people who healed Makenzie. She has now raised over \$40,000 and counting!

Makenzie's long-term prognosis is good, and targeted therapies and monitoring have helped her get back to in-person school and her favorite activities. Her team name for The Blast reflects all that she has been through and all she will accomplish. "Mighty Makenzie" is an inspiration for her community and other kids battling cancer!

The Blast is a family-friendly 5k that raises funds for Cook Children's Hematology and Oncology Center. Each year, the Center diagnoses 250 new cancer cases. The need for cancer research is ever-pressing and our patients need accessible treatment options. Every dollar raised for The Blast helps us bring world-class treatments and clinical trials to Fort Worth, so our patients can receive the lifesaving care they need closer to home.

Origin story

At the age of four, Michael Mancuso was diagnosed with neuroblastoma. As Michael underwent treatment for this rare and aggressive form of cancer, his friend Alexa Sankary made a promise to him that she would help find a cure. Michael passed away just three years later, and Alexa created The Blast to honor Michael's memory and raise research funds in the hope of finding a cure for those still fighting. In the 17 years since then, The Blast has grown into a special community walk that invites every child and family affected by pediatric cancer to join together for a day of celebration, remembrance, and hope. The Blast continues to raise funds for lifesaving cancer treatment and research as we never give up on finding a cure.

Fast facts about childhood cancer

- 1 in 264 kids in the U.S. will have cancer before they turn 20
- The average age of a child at the time of their cancer diagnosis is 10
- Cancers involving solid tumors account for approximately 40% of pediatric cancer cases
- 85% of children with cancer become long-term survivors

Fast facts about Cook Children's

- Cook Children's treats 250 new cancer cases each year
- Cook Children's has performed over 1,100 stem cell transplants since 1986
- Cook Children's has 21 doctors dedicated to serving H/O patients
- Cook Children's was the first medical center in the Southwest to build a neuroblastoma I-131
 MIBG treatment center
